STUDY WITH FORMISSION

We welcome students who are passionate to develop their skills in missional leadership and ready to bring about change in this world with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Our undergraduate programmes aim to equip students to be missionally effective in their church or ministry context through accredited training, thought leadership and missional support. Our undergraduate programmes focus on missional and biblical theology, with practical application to prepare you for employment after graduating.

HOW THE PROGRAMME WORKS

The programme combines theological and biblical study with a mission emphasis and practical work experience throughout.

You will gain an understanding of missional theology and explore the foundations of Christian belief, practice and missional ministry within your chosen church, organisation or training context.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The programme is divided into three elements: class time, practical work-based learning, and independent study. The programme is structured around taught modules through our facilitated learning.

This is supported by tutorials, cluster groups and personal formation throughout the programme. This method of study will give you invaluable experience to equip you for employment after you graduate.

PROGRAMME CONTENT

You will study the core areas of Biblical Studies (Old and New Testament), Theology, Mission and Ministry, as well as other subjects, such as Missional Leadership or Youth Ministry, depending on your chosen optional modules.

You will study at your chosen campus and engage in a range of work-based learning in your local context, designed to develop your skills in mission and ministry.

As well as the traditional essay there is a range of assessment on the programme, including presentations, sermons, research projects, and practical work-based tasks.

PROGRAMME RESOURCES

You will receive detailed study guides for every module, lecture, and workshop. All resources will be made available to you online through our Virtual Learning Environment, Moodle.

• Learning Resources: You will have access to detailed study guides and to the College's online library and lending resources via Moodle (Virtual Learning Environment). You will use these to prepare for participation in classes, tutorials, and to help you include assignments, such as essays or reports, and sometimes class presentations or debates.

- Work-based Learning: You will gain
 work experience in an organisational
 and/or ministry context, to enable you to
 develop practical skills and experience of
 Christian leadership.
- Regular Tutorials and Supervision:
 You will meet regularly with your
 Campus Leader and with your Work-based Supervisor. Work-based assessment,
 including a portfolio, is an important
 element of the programme.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

All of our programmes are built on five areas of formation:

- Personal Formation: developing the interpersonal communication skills which make it possible for people to respond well to your leadership style.
- 2. *Intellectual Formation:* learning cutting edge theories which can be tested in your work-based learning context.
- Ministry Formation: developing the character of Christ the disciple-maker – becoming like Christ the missional leader par excellence.
- 4. *Missional Formation:* learning the key ideas and skills needed to equip the church for God's mission through missional leadership.
- 5. *Spiritual Formation:* helping students to develop spiritual practices that enable them to have a deeper relationship with God and discern God's mission.

STUDY OPTIONS

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

BA (HONS) IN THEOLOGY, MISSION AND MINISTRY WITH SPECIALISM IN MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP

3 years full-time, 6 years part-time. (This pathway is **not** available at the Ledbury Campus with Reign Ministries.)

BA (HONS) IN THEOLOGY, MISSION AND MINISTRY WITH SPECIALISM IN YOUTH WORK

3 years full-time, 6 years part-time. (This pathway is **only** available at the Ledbury Campus with Reign Ministries.)

BA (HONS) IN THEOLOGY, MISSION AND MINISTRY WITH FOUNDATION YEAR

The Foundation Year is an additional year of study to enable students to develop academic and other skills before commencing the BA Degree.

Foundation Year is 1 year full-time. BA Degree is 3 years full-time, 6 years part-time.

(The Foundation Year is not available part time. The Foundation Year is not available at residential campuses. The Foundation Year is subject to availability at other campuses.)

BA (HONS) TOP-UP IN THEOLOGY, MISSION AND MINISTRY

1 year full-time, 2 years part-time. *The Top-Up Year* is Year 3 of the programme. It is aimed at students who have completed a Foundation Degree or a DipHE and want to obtain a BA (Hons) Degree.

EXIT AWARDS

- If you exit the programme after passing Year 1 of the BA, you will be awarded a CertHE IN THEOLOGY, MISSION AND MINISTRY.
- If you exit the programme after passing Year 2 of the BA, you will be awarded a DipHE IN THEOLOGY, MISSION AND MINISTRY

OPTIONS FOR STUDY

ForMission's programmes are available in multiple locations, which we refer to as campuses. Some campuses meet weekly, and some campuses meet for week-long conferences several times per year.

OPTION 1

REGIONAL CAMPUS WITH WEEKLY ATTENDANCE

Our programmes can be studied full-time or part-time at one of our campuses. If you are studying at a regional campus, a typical week in Year 1 of the programme will look something like this, depending on whether you are studying full-time or part-time:

- Full-time: typically, class time is 1-2 days, work-based learning for 12 hours per week, and 1-2 days per week for independent study.
- *Part-time:* class time is 0.5-1 day, work-based learning for 6 hours per week, and 0.5-1 day per week for independent study.

For Mission's regional campuses are in Birmingham, London, and Manchester.

OPTION 2

ONLINE CAMPUS WITH WEEKLY ONLINE ATTENDANCE

Our programmes can be studied full-time or part-time at our online campuses. This is similar to the previous option, but attendance at weekly classes and tutorial supervision is entirely via video conferencing software (e.g. Zoom). Weekly classes can be either in the daytime or in the evening (subject to availability). Students would be able to live at home and undertake workbased learning in their local area. Students would be required to attend a ForMission Campus for induction and one or two further events per year.

OPTION 3

REGIONAL CAMPUS WITH STUDY WEEKS

Kingdom Faith operates a campus that meets in Horsham, West Sussex.

This campus delivers the programme of teaching through six study weeks each year, combined with weekly online video contact for tutorials and cluster sessions. Students at this campus can travel to Horsham for teaching days, or we can help students to find accommodation during teaching weeks. This campus is operated by *Kingdom Faith* in partnership with ForMission.

OPTION 4

RESIDENTIAL CAMPUS WITH STUDY WEEKS

Our residential campuses deliver the same programme of teaching through five or six study weeks each year, combined with weekly online video contact for tutorials and cluster sessions. Our residential campuses are operated in partnership with different organisations:

MODULES FOR THE BA (HONS) (TOP-UP) IN THEOLOGY, MISSION AND MINISTRY

Students on the Top-Up programme take modules from the Year 3 of the BA (Hons) in Theology, Mission and Ministry.

These can be either the modules from the Missional Leadership Specialism, or the modules from the Youth Work Specialism. The award does not include a specialism in the title.

APPLYING FOR OUR BA PROGRAMME

TUITION FEES

Our aim is to make tuition as affordable as possible to empower more people to serve in a wide range of church and mission situations.

BA (HONS) THEOLOGY, MISSION AND MINISTRY (WITH OR WITHOUT FOUNDATION YEAR)

£6,950 per year for full-time study.

Fees for part-time study will be calculated proportionally.

Eligible students who need to access UK student loan funding, will be registered with Newman University under a franchise agreement between ForMission and Newman University.

Successful applicants who wish to apply for student finance will need to complete an admissions process with Newman University after their acceptance with ForMission.

ADDITIONAL COSTS

Students are expected to have suitable computer and internet access to complete assessments. Students will be expected to buy some books each year.

This will typically cost £125 per year.

Students are expected to pay for their own travel to and from their campus and to and from their work-based learning.

Most students like to celebrate their success at the end of their degree by attending graduation. *Hiring a gown for the ceremony cost £50 in 2021*.

If students are studying at the residential campus operated by Reign Ministries, there is an annual conference delivery fee of £650, which may be subject to annual increase.

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

- 1. A minimum of 80 UCAS points or equivalent level 3 qualification(s).
- 2. If you do not meet the educational requirements, you will need to pass an initial student evaluation in order be eligible for entry to the programme.
- 3. We also consider applications for entry with Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) on a case by case basis.
- 4. As part of the admissions process you will be invited to interview at the campus where you intend to study.
- 5. Where English is not your first language, you will be asked to pass a test at B2 level for direct entry onto the BA course.

MA PROGRAMMES

PROGRAMME AIMS

These programmes aim to equip those in leadership in Christian churches, organisations and communities with the ability to engage in and develop contextually-focused appropriate approaches to missional leadership and practice in postmodern societies.



The MA programme has four distinct specialist pathways*:

- 1. MA Missional Leadership
- MA Missional Leadership and Spirituality
- 3. MA Missional Leadership and European Studies
- 4. Missional Leadership and Social Entrepreneurship

*pathways are offered subject to sufficient numbers of students

HOW THE PROGRAMMES WORK

We aim to advance students' knowledge and critical understanding of contemporary issues in mission, drawing on missiology, sociology, psychology, leadership studies, theology and biblical studies.

The taught module assessments and the dissertation module offer students opportunities to develop their particular interests in these fields, and the skills of independent study and research in a discipline of their choice.

WHO ARE THE PROGRAMMES AIMED AT?

The programmes are aimed at a wide range of students who are in some form of Christian ministry within churches, mission agencies or community organisations/projects.

STUDY OPTIONS

The Programmes are studied part-time and either fully online, or mainly online with some face to face classes.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The programmes are completed in three years. The first two years comprise six taught modules: three core modules, two specialist modules and one further optional module. The dissertation module is completed in the third year on a subject of the student's own choice (within a field relevant to the named award). Entry points for 2022-23 are September 2022, January 2023 and Summer 2023.

WHAT DOES A TYPICAL YEAR LOOK LIKE?

Teaching takes place either online, or in Birmingham (all programmes except European Studies) or in Amsterdam (European Studies Programme). Individual modules are facilitated in different ways with a mixture of stand-alone study days, or as intensives of two or more study days including overnight stays (European Studies Programme only). There may be a need for tuition times or delivery modes to be changed, due to situations outside our control, such as sickness, or government guidelines.

PROGRAMME SPECIALISMS

The MA programmes allow students to study a broad range of topics related to their chosen specialism.

The emphasis of the programmes is on contemporary expressions of Christian faith and practice.

STUDENTS STUDY THREE CORE MODULES ON ALL PROGRAMMES

PERSPECTIVES IN CONTEMPORARY MISSION

Enabling students to engage with the challenges of secularisation, postmodernity and the influence of the church in contemporary Western society.

MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP: FORMATION AND SKILLS

Examining the task of leadership, and the skills needed to equip the church effectively in God's mission today.

RESEARCH METHODOLOGIES AND CONTEXTUAL THEOLOGY

Quantitative and qualitative methods in both local and global contexts, contextual theology, theology of place and social justice in wider society.

TWO PROGRAMME-SPECIFIC SPECIALIST MODULES

MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP: COMMUNICATION AND TEAMWORKING

Exploring the theory and skills of interpersonal leadership and communication, building and developing teams and developing self-awareness.

MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP AND ENGAGEMENT WITH CONTEMPORARY CULTURE

Examining cultural theory, trends and the Church's mission in a postmodern, secular context through missional perspectives and practices.

MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP AND SPIRITUALITY PROGRAMME

SPIRITUAL FORMATION AND PRACTICES

Identifying distinctively Christian concepts of 'community' including themes of discipleship and intentional Christian communities and their practices.

SPIRITUALITY IN CONTEMPORARY CULTURE

Exploring approaches to spirituality of missional movements in local communities and the wider cultural context of globalisation, postmodernism and secularism.

MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP AND EUROPEAN STUDIES

EUROPEAN STUDIES: THE MAKING OF EUROPE

Exploring the role of Christianity in the making of Europe and the idea and paradox of 'Europe' in the past and present.

EUROPEAN STUDIES: CONTEMPORARY CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

Exploring the Gospel and Europe as a 'post Christian' secular context, with multi-religious identities, and European (dis)-integration.

MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP AND SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP

FAITH-BASED SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP: MODELS, APPROACHES AND ROLES

Exploring a range of approaches to social entrepreneurship in which outcomes have holistic measures; the nature of pioneering forms of ministry; models and case-studies of faith-based social entrepreneurship; examining the range of roles required to manage transitions from conceptualisation to the development of a mature social enterprise business.

FAITH-BASED SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP IN CONTEMPORARY CONTEXTS

Exploring historical and contemporary models/ case studies) and approaches to social entrepreneurship in the context of the changing nature of the Christian church, and its implications for Christian ministry in the future; examining the appropriateness of contemporary Christian approaches to social entrepreneurship in the context of both local communities and the wider cultural context of globalisation, postmodernism and secularism and evaluating various responses to local and global crises.

ALL PROGRAMMES REQUIRE A DISSERTATION MODULE

DISSERTATION MODULE

The final module, which is undertaken throughout year 3, is the dissertation project and students have an opportunity to choose a topic to research in depth and which will relate to their chosen MA specialism. This project will include an in-depth literature review of key theories and concepts and significant practical field research which will usually include some original content and perspectives.

OPTIONAL MODULES AVAILABLE ON ALL PROGRAMMES*

Students study one optional module out of the following:

URBAN MISSION: LEADERSHIP CHALLENGES

Exploring Trinitarian approaches to urban community development, alleviation of urban poverty and evaluating leadership challenges.

GLOBALISATION, MIGRATION AND MULTI-DIRECTIONAL MISSION

Evaluating neo-colonialism, globalisation, multi-directional migration, contemporary cultural shifts and global and local trends in cross-cultural mission and expressions of 'new Christianities'.

MISSIONAL LEADERSHIP IN EUROPEAN HISTORY

Engaging in a two-week European studies tour, with readings, presentations and seminars on the Christian heritage of Europe and key missional leaders and movements in the European context. A virtual tour may be offered instead of, or in addition to, a physical tour.

FORMING AND LEADING MISSIONAL COMMUNITIES

Exploring community practice, mentoring and managing conflict as part of forming and leading healthy missional communities.

INDEPENDENT STUDY MODULE

Identifying a topic, issue, or ministerial area relevant to an aspect of missional leadership and developing an independent learning project including library and practical research.

* Subject to sufficient student numbers.

PROGRAMME RESOURCES

Student resources include college-produced material, with access to a wide-ranging online journal database, electronic resources and the College's online virtual learning provision. The programme includes personal development though guided personal reflection, ensuring students' studies and practical ministry continually inform each other.

TEACHING STAFF

Our academic staff are also involved in leadership roles which gives the programmes a clear practical focus and place a high value on research and reflective practice.



APPLYING FOR OUR MA PROGRAMMES

FEES

Our aim is to make training as affordable as possible to empower more people to serve in a wide range of church and mission situations.

Fees are £9,300 for the whole programme (payment plan by agreement).

Any required meals and/or costs of accommodation are included in the fees for MA programmes.

Eligible students who need to access UK student loan funding, will be registered with Newman University under a franchise agreement between ForMission and Newman University.

If you exit the MA programme after passing one year, you will be awarded a **PGCert.** If you leave after passing two years, you will be awarded a **PGDip**. subject to fulfilling all requirements of the exit awards

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

- A good first degree (first, upper second or strong lower second) or Graduate Diploma in Theology or related subject.
- 2. Previous awards do not need to be in theology and a degree in a related subject is usually sufficient evidence of an ability to engage with the programme.
- 3. Students without a degree but who can demonstrate significant ministry experience will also be considered, subject to appropriate assessment.
